An Empirical Investigation of Decision Aids to Improve Auditor Effectiveness in Analytical Review

My dissertation introduces two new decision aids that are designed to reduce the cognitive load placed upon inexperienced auditors during analytical review. I find that each decision aid improves auditors' analytical review effectiveness during the hypothesis generation, hypothesis evaluation, and hypothesis selection stages.
